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Dear Parents, Students and Staff,

We have chosen to use marbles rather than jelly beans as we are a 'Healthy Lifestyle' school and as such restrict the usage of lollies and sugary treats in our school. Another matter for which I am requesting support from our parent community is the road safety of our students around the school. I am aware that parking is a particular issue at present, especially with the additional vehicles around due to the road works on Tonkin Highway. However I need to impress upon our community the need for patience and caution, especially during peak drop off and pick up times. Can I also please remind parents not to park in the Kiss and Drive zone of the school. This area is for parents to stop briefly to allow children who are already waiting in the area to get into the car. By parking in the zone, parents are stopping the flow of traffic which is causing people to slow down and/or stop in inappropriate areas. Recently there have been a number of incidents that could have had serious consequences but also could have been avoided. I appreciate your assistance.
